Ingredients

- Wheat flour, salt, oil and water

ONLINE IS NOT ALWAYS ALIGNED

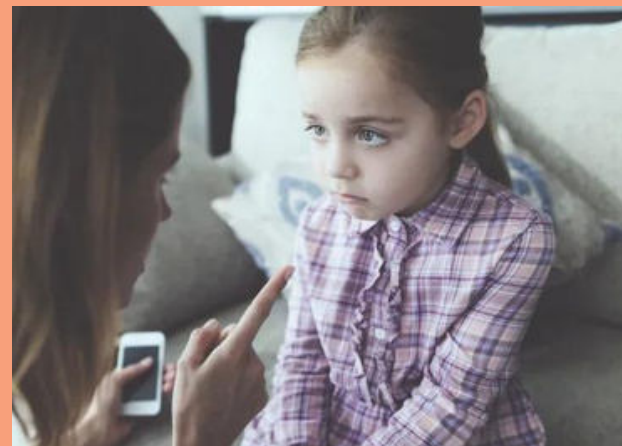

-Sit with your child, and ask questions about what he/she is doing or seeing online.

-Choose a shared space where all members of the family are present to access the technology.

-Consider setting limits to technology such as two hours per day.
